Opening times are given, in this key to the numbered points of special interest on the route, for the two museums that are included.

THINGS TO SEE IN THE CITY

- 1 Round Church, one of only four such Norman churches in the country.
- 2 St John's College, backing on to the Bridge of Sighs.
- 3 Trinity College, founded by Henry VIII and built around the largest of the university quadrangles.
- 4 Trinity Hall, small college, once famed for law students, containing fine collection of silver plate.
- 5 Clare College, approached by the most beautiful of the city's bridges.
- 6 King's College Chapel, containing fine carvings and stained glass, and home of one of Britain's most famous choirs.
- 7 Queen's College, backing on to the Mathematical Bridge. Beyond Silver Street turn right for the Fitzwilliam Museum, open Tues. to Sat. 10 a.m. - 5 p.m., Sun. 2.15 - 5 p.m. Closed Dec. 25, 26, Jan. 1 and Good Friday.
- 8 Old Court, Corpus Christi, founded in 1352. Also St Benet's Church.
- 9 Great St Mary's Church (the University Church). View of city from the tower.
- 10 Market Hill, daily open-air market. Tourist office behind Guildhall. Information book in the market.
- 11 Sidney Sussex College, in the city's main shopping street.
- 12 Magdalene Bridge. Punting and rowing boats can be hired here.
- 13 Magdalene College, the colleges on the left bank of the river. Opposite are some of the city's oldest medieval houses.
- 14 Folk Museum, open Tues. to Sat. 10.30 a.m. - 5 p.m., Sun. 2.30 - 4.30 p.m.
- 15 St Peter's Church. Opposite (the side of the street) is Shute Hall.

CAR PARKS: Lion Yard, New Square (between Jesus Lane, then turn right), Park Street, St John's (near Fitzwilliam Museum), 40 at Lamport Road (right), Gold Street (off Fitzroy Street on right), Square, Queen Anne Terrace.

- 15 St Peter's Church, Opposite the side of Castle Street is Stone Hall.

CAR PARKS: Lion Yard, New Square, Foresters and St. John's Lane, then turn right, Park Street, Queen Street, Fitzwilliam Museum, left at Landis Road, then right, Gold Street (off Trinity Street on right bank, New Square), Queen Anne Terrace.

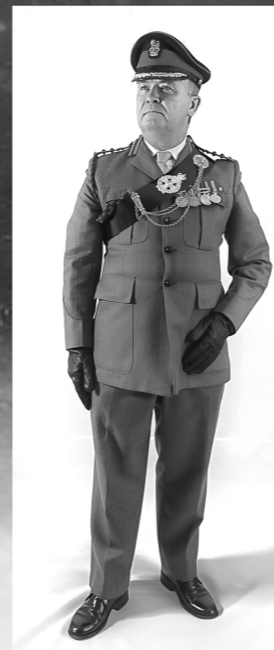
